Silvio pay for sex? No, he could get it for free

ITALIAN prime minister Silvio Berlusconi has been accused of paying girls £1,700 to spend the night with him at his luxury villas.

Former showgirl girl Patricia D'Addario claims she was offered the cash to spend the night at Mr Berlusconi's official Rome residence Palazzo Giustiniani – but took only half because she did not stay the night.

It was not clear from her interview whether the 42-year-old had sex or was expected to have sex with the PM but she added that she "knew she had made an impression on him because he asked me what I did".

It was also claimed that officials in Bari looking into a prostitution racket had questioned three other women and they too claimed they had been paid to attend parties.

The 32-year-old premier has also been accused of financing in former French president Jacques Chirac about the number of women he

had slept with. But Mr Berlusconi's chief legal adviser, Nicola Cosentino, said yesterday: "To think that Berlusconi needs to pay a girl £1,700 (£1,700) so they will sleep with him seems to me to be a little too much."

I think that he could have an enormous amount of women for free."

Berlusconi has great respect for women and would not dream of paying one to have sex with him." Mr Berlusconi – who is being divorced by 52-year-old wife Veronica Lario – faced further embarrassment over claims about his boasts to Mr Chirac.

He is alleged to have told the ex-French leader: "See that girl? – you don't know how many bottom cheeks have been on there." He also pointed to women in a pornographic magazine and said "I've had her, her and her", according to L'Espresso magazine.

Friends died in heroin mix-up

THO 'mix-up' was died of drug overdose in a hotel room after thinking the heroin they were snorting was cocaine, an inquest heard yesterday. Mark Gansley, 33, and 36-year-old David Hunt, both of Portwood, Southampton, were killed by lethal 'China White' heroin in Cambridge in February. The mix-up was straight out of the film Pulp Fiction, said Det Con Anne Hedge, a drug intelligence officer. Accidental death verdicts were recorded at the inquest in Southampton.
